Her hope matches that of many who have experienced the harmful effects of drunk driving in their life. According to Students Against Drunk Driving statistics, 346 THS students could have possibly consumed alcohol in mild to excessive amounts. It takes just one drunk driver to kill or be killed.

Which Suit Suits You?


1. Apple Shaped (Widest in the stomach/torso area)
Try a one piece with a bit of *spandex* or *lycra* in your bigger areas. This can tighten your body and make you look slimmer. Draw attention to your best assets. Long legs? Find a suit that has a high cut on the thigh, or find a design that accentuates your upper half and distracts from your middle. Avoid bikinis.

2. Pear Shaped (Bigger on the bottom)
Mix and match bikinis so that you have a solid colored, darker bottom with a lighter colored, patterned top (be sure the colors match). 


